"Pivot Homeward" is a series of discussions about ending militarism as the central tool of U.S. foreign policy -and re-dedicating the treasure spent on war to solving problems here at home. We ask, "What would the U.S. economy, society, and foreign policy look like if they followed UU principles (especially the 6th), and what actions can we take as UUs to move our nation away from violence, and towards nonviolent solutions?" We will take a look at possible civic and political actions individuals can take at the local, state, and national levels.

The nine discussions will be held on the last **Friday** of each month, at UUCR, in Founders Hall (FDH) or Bldg 2, 7:30-9:00pm, led by members of the Peace Studies Group. Childcare will be available on request. We suggest readings of two or three articles per session; pick up some at the Sunday SJC table during coffee; many are free at the webpages cited below.

The phrase "Pivot Homeward" (as opposed to a U.S. "pivot toward Asia," or anywhere else) suggests that, since the bi-polar Cold War is over, Americans can choose to shed our superpower status, curb our military-industrial complex and interventionist foreign policy, shine sunlight on our secret war-makers, deemphasize militarism and punishment in our criminal justice system, and redirect spending on war toward **infrastructure**, **health**, **education**, and **sustainable development** here at home. This is an open forum, where all perspectives will be valued and seriously listened to. Questions, doubts, and critique of this main theme, as well as the specific topic of each discussion, are welcome.

Facilitators and guest discussants aim to create a supportive atmosphere of inquiry, to help those in attendance learn about issues, history, and the huge array of civic actions that citizens may choose among. We make a special effort to invite persons who have experience with other cultures, conflict resolution, and/or war, and to encourage their contributions at these gatherings.
