June Share-the-Plate Recipients

June 6 & 13 Manna Food Center

Since its founding in 1983, Manna Food Center has worked to increase access to nutritious food for all those experiencing hunger and food insecurity in Montgomery County. It does this by directly distributing food to those in need; providing educational programs about nutrition, food preparation and healthy eating; and by connecting those in need with other resource providers. During the past year Manna distributed more than three million pounds of food and served more than 50,000 people.

June 20 & 27 – Housing Unlimited

Housing Unlimited provides affordable, independent housing for adults in mental health recovery in Montgomery County. It provides shared housing at below-market rental rates to qualified individuals. Rent is computed on a sliding scale based on income and is capped to encourage employment and maintain a sense a security. Tenants are responsible for their own health, finances, interpersonal relationships, and maintaining a clean home. With the security of knowing that their housing is secure, these tenants can focus on becoming valued and integrated members of the community. Now in its 27th year, Housing Unlimited currently serves 225 tenants in 82 separate homes.
